

Trial by Fire previously had performed there in August (pictured above).


The venue will open its doors at 6 p.m. There will be no opening act.

Exhibitions at UNCG's Weatherspoon Art Museum



UNCG's Weatherspoon Art Museum will open three exhibitions this winter that tap the museum's collection to explore looking.

The first, "Markmaking," runs through April 3.

The artworks show a plethora of approaches to markmaking, a term used to describe the different types of lines, scratches, smudges, patterns, dots, and textures that result from the way an artist applies a material, such as graphite or paint, to a surface.

The untitled image above by Charles Clough comes from the museum's Dorothy and Herbert Vogel Collection: Fifty Works for Fifty States.

The museum is open to the public with updated hours, capacity limitations to encourage social distancing, and increased health and safety procedures including required face coverings.
