Equipment used: Graphics/Photo scanner and slides tray

Lessons learned: Squinting at slides isn't fun. Digitize them and share them instead! Various trays hold different sizes of slides and negatives. You can scan photos individually or do a stack quickly with the FastFoto scanner (below right).




Amy Butcher is the Director of Creative Writing at OWU and author of *Mother Trucker*, a story about finding joy on the loneliest road in America.




